We are **Together.** We are a charity that protects children's human rights.



Children's rights are what children need to grow up happy, healthy and safe.



Children's rights are written in the United Nations

Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is called the UNCRC for short.



The **UNCRC** is an important agreement between lots of countries who have promised to protect children's rights.

Here are some of the rights in the UNCRC that everyone under the age of 18 has:

- The right to be listened to
- The right to go to school
- The right to be able to play
- The right to be able to relax.



Every year, we write a **report** about children's rights in Scotland.

# Public authorities are

organisations like

- Schools
- Hospitals
- Local councils
- The police



Children will be able to complain to a **judge** if they think their rights are not being protected.



Scotland needs to **get ready** for this new law. We are writing a **report** about what needs to happen.

Our report will say what the Scottish Government, public authorities and other organisations **need to do.** 



It will also give **examples** of where things are going well.

# **Protecting children's rights**



Scottish Government,
public authorities and other
organisations will need to
make sure children's rights
are protected all of the time.

There are lots of ways for them to do this – some which might be new or difficult.





#### Some examples are:

- Giving children a say in decisions.
- **Supporting** children to have their voices heard.
- Training and information so everyone understands children's rights.
- Checking if children feel their rights are protected.
- Making sure there are easy ways for children to complain if things go wrong.
- Thinking about children's rights when making decisions.
