## Children's - UNCRC



#### **CONVENTION** ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

- Established in 1989
- Ratified in UK in 1991
- Articles establish what all children need
- The basic right to protection is supported by the other Articles
- In this sense they interrelate and mutually support the establishing rights for all children

### A rights-based approach

- The UNCRC articles are indivisible and interrelated
- Protection from harm is integral to upholding children's human rights
- UNCRC articles underpin legislation, policy and principles of child protection practice
- Rights based practice is central to child protection practice
- Key Articles include Art 3, 6, 12, 18, 19, 34, 39
- The Articles place obligations on the state to meet them

## GIRFEC


- Underpinned by UNCRC
- Focus on children's needs – wellbeing and development (Art 6)
- Emphasis on early intervention
- Child Protection support seen very much in wider wellbeing context

- Partnership working with families (Art 18)
- Child's voice and needs at the centre (Art 12)
- A child's plan shaped by child's views and needs
- Review and consider legal options




