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# Who are we?




Our name is Together (Scottish Alliance for Children's Rights).



We are a charity who want to make things better for children.




We help babies, children and young people under age 18.

## They told us about:


- Life at home

- Life in Scotland




Children shared what they like and the things they do not like.

# What are children's rights



Children's stories help us know if their rights are being protected in Scotland.



Children's rights are about the things you need to grow up happy, healthy and safe.



Children's rights are written down in a special document called the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).



Scotland has made children's rights part of the law.

## Life at home

#### What children said




Many children feel loved and safe at home.



They feel supported by their parents, carers, brothers, sisters, other family and pets.



Sometimes life at home can be hard.



Children told us examples, like:

- Their family breaks up.
- Their parent or carer is in the army.
- Their parent or carer is in prison.
- They find it hard to talk about their feelings.
- Their home is too small.



Children said more help could make life at home better. Here are some ideas:



The Scottish Government should make sure every child has a safe and comfy home.



They should make sure families have enough money.



It should be easy for children to complain if they are worried.



These changes will help every child feel happy and safe at home.

# Life at nursery, school and college

## What children said




Young children say nursery is fun. They can explore, play, and make friends.



They like kind nursery staff because they help them feel safe.



Children want schools to be safe and welcoming for everyone.



They want to have a say in decisions.



Sometimes life at school is hard.



## Children told us examples, like:

- School buses get cancelled.
- Bullying.
- Rules that are not fair.
- Teachers who shout.
- Children not getting the help they need.

## Ideas to help



Teachers should follow children's rights all of the time.



Teachers should be kind and not shout.



Schools should do more to stop bullying.



Schools should give children more of a say in decisions.



These changes will help children feel listened to and supported.

# Life in the local community

#### What children said




Some children live in the city. Others live in towns, villages or the countryside.



Children want to spend time with their friends.



They also want to be in nature and visit parks.



Youth clubs help children relax, have fun and learn new things.




Children told us some things they are worried about:

- Buses that are always late.
- Parks that are untidy or not safe.
- People drinking alcohol or using drugs.
- Not enough cycle lanes.
- Youth club funding getting stopped.



Children want cleaner and safer places to enjoy. Here are some ideas to help:



Town planners should speak to children and think about their rights when making decisions.



Adults should keep parks and public spaces clean and safe for everyone.



Adults should make it easy for children to report problems in their community.

Lots of children go online every day.



It helps them connect with friends, learn new things, relax, and have fun.




Sometimes they spend too much time online.

- Scary content.




Here are some ideas to help:

Lots of children and young people enjoy living in Scotland.




They love nature, the landscape, free university, and free buses.



There are some things children want to change about living in Scotland:


- Make it a fairer country for everyone.
