

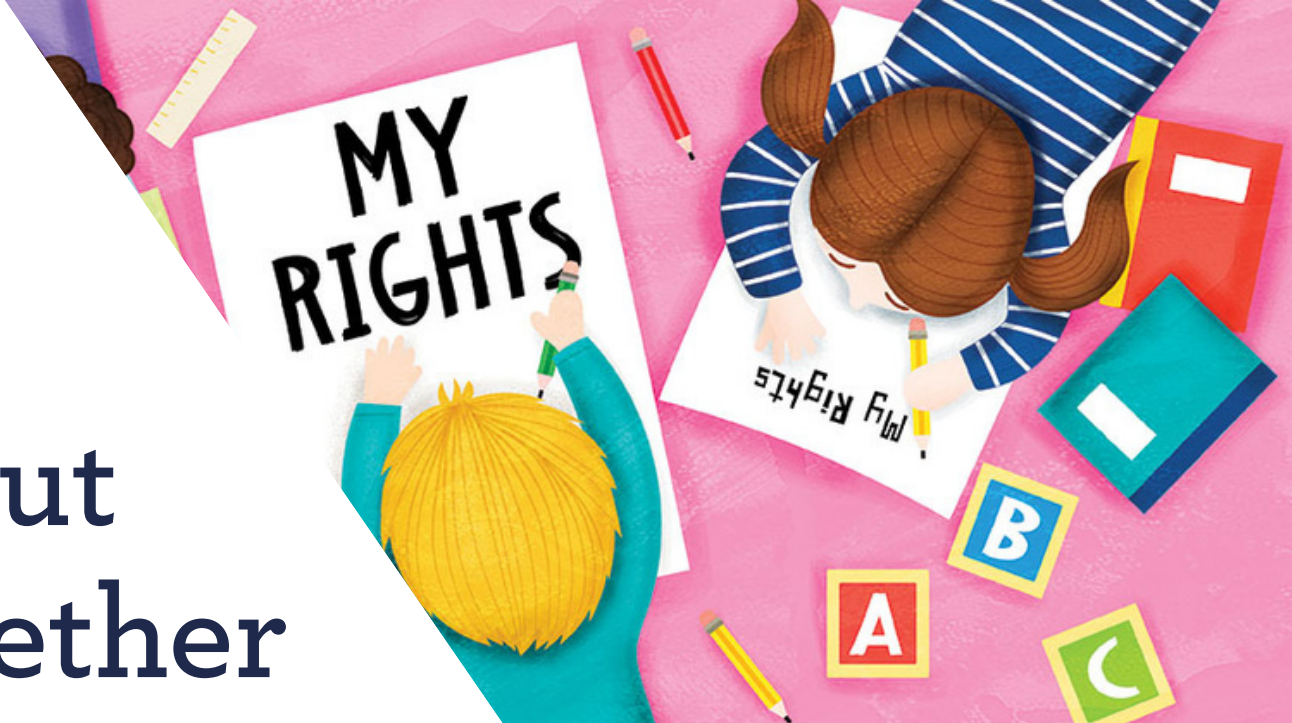

About Together



Together is an alliance of Scottish children's charities that works to improve the awareness, understanding and implementation of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

We do this by:

- Promoting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child
- Helping children's organisations to integrate the UNCRC into their work
- Monitoring and reporting on the progress made at a Scottish and UK level

Our growing membership is made up of a range of children's charities, from small local playgroups through to large international charities, alongside individuals, academics and professionals with an interest in children's rights.

For 25 years, Together has been helping organisations and individuals from a range of backgrounds and roles to improve their awareness and understanding of children's human rights in practice.

This has included work on the [Skills and Knowledge project](#), which explores what professionals need to know and apply to be able to implement children's human rights.



Training sessions

We offer:

Introductory UNCRC and children's human rights approach training

Full day children's human rights approach session

Focused training sessions covering:

- Interpreting the UNCRC
- Child Rights Impact Assessments



Introductory UNCRC and children's human rights approach training

Join Together online for an introductory overview of how to implement the five principles of a children's human rights approach in your work and organisation. The UNCRC (Incorporation) (Scotland) Act 2024 brought important children's rights protections into law in Scotland, and taking a children's human rights approach is crucial to ensure that children's rights are implemented in practice.

The workshop aims to equip attendees with:

- An introduction to the UNCRC
- An understanding of the UNCRC (Incorporation) (Scotland) Act 2024
- How they can consider children's rights in their work
- Introductory knowledge of the five principles of a children's human rights approach
- Ideas for how to implement the five principles in their working practice
- Resources for further study

This training session is followed by a drop-in six months after your training to allow you to ask any questions about the issues you are facing as you implement your training knowledge.

Full day children's human rights approach session

Join Together online to develop a detailed understanding of how to implement the five principles of a children's human rights approach in your work and organisation. With the UNCRC (Incorporation) (Scotland) Act 2024 strengthening legal protections, this session focuses on turning children's rights into practice in all areas.

This training aims to equip attendees with:

- A clear understanding of the five principles of a Children's Human Rights Approach and how they connect
- Practical ways to apply children's rights in your work
- Examples of ideas and tools to support implementation
- Resources for further study

The session will draw on real-life examples, the Children's Rights Skills and Knowledge Framework, and will cover topics including Child Rights Impact Assessments, child rights monitoring, participation, evidence gathering, budgeting and equal access to rights for all children.

All attendees will receive a participant pack to get familiar with materials and key concepts in advance. This training session is followed by a drop-in six months after your training to allow you to ask any questions about the issues you are facing as you implement your training knowledge.

Focused training sessions

UNCRC (Incorporation) (Scotland) Act 2024

Join Together online to explore:

- The history of the UNCRC Act
- The content of the UNCRC Act
- Scottish Government's Children's Scheme
- Scottish Government Guidance
- The different roles the Act gives for Scottish Government, the Scottish Parliament, public bodies, and civil society.

Join Together online to build your confidence in interpreting the UNCRC in depth. This session will explore how to use wider international human rights guidance – such as Concluding Observations and General Comments – to better understand children's rights and apply them in practice. You will leave better equipped to support implementation and strengthen your children's rights advocacy.

Child Rights Impact Assessments

Join Together online to build your understanding of Child Rights Impact Assessments and their role in implementing children's rights. This session will help you to:

- Decide when an assessment is required
- Understand a proportionate approach
- Explore different models
- Gather evidence
- Embed children's participation
- Support effective monitoring and evaluation
- Think about publication and child friendly versions
